FORD'S NASCAR REGULARS BURTON & SMITH HANG ON TO WIN MICHELIN PILOT CHALLENGE OPENER

ASCAR driver Harrison Burton held off hard-charging sports car veteran Spencer Pumpelly by a slight 0.688 seconds to earn the overall victory in Friday's BMW M Endurance Challenge, the season-opening IMSA

Michelin Pilot Challenge race on the 3.56-mile Daytona International Speedway road course.

Pumpelly, who co-drove with Jeroen Bleekemolen and Tom Collingwood, moved the No. 83 BGB Motorsports Porsche 718 GT4 RS Clubsport from fifth place to second in the final 30 minutes of the four-hour race, applying pressure on Burton as he cut into the lead with each lap.

But the 22-year-old Burton – who drives the famed Wood Brothers Ford fulltime in the NASCAR Cup Series – steered mistake-free, high-pressure circuits of his own in the No. 42 PF Racing Ford Mustang GT4 to ensure he and teammate Zane Smith – the 2022 NASCAR Craftsman Truck Series champion making his IMSA debut – became the first NASCAR regulars to take the victory in this race.

Ben Rhodes, the 2021 NASCAR trucks champion, and fellow NASCAR truck series driver Hailie Deegan finished third in the No. 41 PF Racing Mustang to complete the podium for the 32-car Grand Sport (GS) class.

Smith, 23, qualified an impressive third and moved forward immediately on the start, holding a sizable lead with just under three hours remaining. Late pit strategy by the competition, however, shifted the lineup as the No. 41 Mustang pitted to change drivers – Smith out and Burton in – just past the midpoint.

Burton ran third with just under 50 minutes to go, steadily making his way forward. He took the lead for good when leader Elliott Skeer in No. 47 Nolasport Porsche had to retire with 22 minutes remaining.

"I felt like I was a little bummed out early because we got shuffled back a little after the first pit stop," said Burton, making his second start in the race. "It was taking me a little bit to get back to the lead and I was like, 'I don't want to be the guy that lets the team down and not finish the race off like we should."





"But a few restarts came our way and I kinda shuffled my way through there. A lot of hard racing, '' he added with a grin. "Pretty similar to NASCAR racing, to be honest with you, the amount of bumping and aggressive dive bombs and stuff. I felt kinda home in that. That was fun."

Smith, who will attempt to make his first Daytona 500 start in February, gave a thumbs-up to his friend Burton's work.

"Watching Harrison at the end with Spencer coming had me shaking in my boots, but he didn't make a mistake," Smith said, delighting in the win at the famous track. "If you can win anything at Daytona, whether it's a dirt bike or a gokart or a stock car and now a GT4 Mustang, is just so dang cool.

"Daytona just brings such a different vibe than really any other racetrack. Not only to win at Daytona but in our first start is just so cool."

Tord has treated Mustang anniversaries in different ways over the years; sometimes with a dedicated model, sometimes with an anniversary option package and sometimes by ignoring it completely. Until 2015, the anniversary models all used 1964 as the birth year of the Mustang. It will be interesting to see if they if they choose 2024 for a potential 60th anniversary model. It would make sense, due to the 2024 Mustang being

the first year of the new generation.

To celebrate the Fortieth Anniversary in 2004, Ford offered 40th Anniversary package which was an option for V6 and GT coupes and convertibles with the premium trim. Approximately 5,700 vehicles were produced with the package.

There were only three paint colors available with the anniversary package; Black, Oxford White and Crimson Red which was exclusive to the 40th Anniversary

package. All had a Medium Parchment interior with the upgrade package. The convertibles also got a Deluxe Parchment cloth top, similar to the Cobra models.

For the \$895.00 MSRP, buyers also got Arizona Beige Metallic tape stripes across the hood, decklid and rocker panels as well as, that same color accent paint for the wheels. Also borrowed from the Cobra, were color-keyed dual foldaway sideview

> mirrors. The anniversary cars were also specified rear spoiler delete. The interior featured a 40th Anniversary badge just ahead of the shifter and the obligatory anniversary logo floor mats. This month's feature car is a Black 2004 Gt convertible with the 40th Anniversary package. The car is currently owned by Mike DeLiberto who purchased the car from former GSRMC members.

John & Linda Dunsmuir. They were the second owners of the car, having purchased it in 2005. This black pony now has only a little over 15,000 miles on the odometer.

For the most part the car is still in original condition as you might expect of a car with so few miles. The rear bumper was

refinished, but the rest of the paint is in excellent

condition. The original Goodyear tires were still on it when Mike took ownership. The Dunsmuirs were excellent caretakers, and the car came with a binder with all the receipts and service records.

This anniversary GT drop top is loaded with just about every option, but it is notable for what it doesn't have. Besides the aforementioned spoiler delete as part of the anniversary package, the car was also ordered without traction control and ABS, unusual in 2004.

It is powered by a SOHC, 2V modular V8 backed by the optional 4-speed automatic transmission. The 260 horsepower is put to the ground by a limited slip rear axle with 3.27 gears.

The car does have a few additions that were added by the Dunsmuirs. If you have a 2004 Mustang brochure handy, under dealer accessories you will see a Windstop, which was a foldable or removable mesh screen that blocked the wind when driving with the top down. This car also has Ford part #F4ZZ-18A179-A, which are plastic covers for the shock towers. The final "modification" is a

color-matched, two-piece, fiberglass tonneau cover.

The plan is for this pampered pony to be used for club-related activities and sunny day driving. I would like to enter it in some shows and take it to MCA events possibly entering either the Street Driven Concours or Unrestored classes. I'm looking into the best classification for



the car.
